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




Treasurer Araseli Bucher

Magic of Music Docent

The Magic of Music Program has provided musical enrichment to Walteria's students for the past twenty years. Students of all grade levels get to explore a wide range of music and instrumentation through Magic of Music.

We need docents and assistants to teach the lessons, and NO EXPERIENCE in music is necessary! You just have to be comfortable presenting a lesson to your child's class. Detailed lesson plans, materials, and training are provided. There are only 9 lessons (about one per month) for the whole school year. Classroom time is flexible and arranged with the teacher. Explore the Arts and Express Yourself

National PTA's Reflections program provides opportunities for recognition and access to the arts which boost student confidence and success in the arts and in life.

Each year, over 300,000 students in Pre-K through Grade 12 create original works of art in response to a student-selected theme. This 50+ year-old program helps them explore their own thoughts, feelings, and ideas, develop artistic literacy, increase confidence, and find a love for learning that will help them become more successful in school and in life.

The 2021–2022 Reflections theme is "I Will Change the World By..."

Students submit their completed works of art in one or all of the available arts categories: Dance Choreography, Film Production, Literature, Music Composition, Photography, Visual Arts.

Students participate in the appropriate division for their grade: Primary (Pre-K - Grade 2), Intermediate (Grades 3-5), Middle School (Grades 6-8), High School (Grades 9-12), Special Artist (All grades welcome). Students who identify as having a disability and may receive services under IDEA or ADA: Section 504 may enter in the Special Artist Division or grade division most closely aligned to their functional abilities.

All entries will be due October 12, 2021.
