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
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
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
#### **Walteria STEAM Fair**

## COVID-19 TESTING



TUSD is offering free COVID-19 testing for students and employees.

Testing centers are located in the Performing Arts Center/Auditorium at each of the four high schools.

Students are not required to get regular testing. However, if they are exhibiting Covid-19 related symptoms or have been identified as a close contact of someone with Covid-19 and need access to testing, the District is offering free testing at all four of our high schools for your convenience.

#### **Testing Hours:**

Testing is available Monday thru Friday from 10 a.m. until 6 p.m. at North, South, and West High Schools, and Torrance High School.

Testing locations are closed for lunch between 1:00-1:30 pm

Please arrive no later than 5:30 Monday-Thusday.

Please arrive by 5 pm on Fridays to ensure samples are processed over the weekend.

When you arrive at the testing site, you will be asked to register your student, provide an email address (to get test results) and proof of insurance (you can still get tested without this information). Results will be emailed to you, typically within 48 hours.

South High School: 4801 Pacific Coast Hwy, Torrance, CA 90505

Torrance High School: 2200 W Carson St, Torrance, CA 90501

West High School: 20401 Victor St, Torrance, CA 90503

# DROP OFF / PICK UP LINE PROCEDURES

Every weekday morning, approximately 650 children are dropped off at Walteria between 8:35 and 9:00 AM. This creates a surge of traffic, and many people are exhibiting very unsafe behavior as they approach this crowded area.

In order to protect our kids and keep everyone safe during drop off and pick up, here are a few helpful reminders about the official process.

Traffic moves CONTINUOUSLY in the drop off/pick up line.

Do NOT park your car anywhere within the drop off zone during drop off/pick up times. LOADING ZONE: NO PARKING signs are clearly posted along the street. Drivers should NOT exit their vehicles during drop off or pick up.

If your child needs assistance getting in or out of the vehicle, park your car on a side street and walk with them.

Do NOT allow children to exit the vehicle into the street. They should exit on the curb side ONLY.


Traffic moves only ONE WAY in the drop off/pick up line.

Do NOT back up into the line to parallel park at the curb. Drive forward only, and pull as far forward as you can to make room for others.

DO NOT make a U-Turn across Madison to cut into the line.

If you park facing south on Madison (opposite the school) you MUST walk to one of the crosswalks to cross the street.

Do NOT jaywalk across Madison or send children to do so on their own.



#### **Pedestrian Safety**

Our crossing guards are hard at work every day trying to keep everyone safe on their way to and from school. Please follow their cues when crossing the street, and be sure to wait for them to clear the intersection before stepping out into traffic.

Do not park your car too close to the crosswalks. It creates a dangerous lack of visibility for everyone involved – motorists, pedestrians, and the crossing guards.

Jaywalking is not only illegal, it's also extremely dangerous. Only cross the streets at the crosswalks, please!
