

Adventures in Art Docent

Adventures in Art docents teach a total of five art projects in their designated classroom over the course of the school year. Art experience is not required, just a love of art and the willingness to share it with students.

As a volunteer docent, you will attend Walteria's Adventures in Art (AIA) workshops to learn the techniques and processes for the year's art projects, coordinate with the classroom teacher to present them to the students, and assist with a schoolwide art show.

Magic of Music Docent

The Magic of Music Program has provided musical enrichment to Walteria's students for the past twenty years. Students of all grade levels get to explore a wide range of music and instrumentation through Magic of Music.

We need docents and assistants to teach the lessons, and NO EXPERIENCE in music is necessary! You just have to be comfortable presenting a lesson to your child's class. Detailed lesson plans, materials, and training are provided. There are only 9 lessons (about one per month) for the whole school year. Classroom time is flexible and arranged with the teacher. Your child will love having you help in their classroom.

Room Parent

The room parent's duties vary from one class to another, but their primary responsibility is communication. The PTA relies on room parents to notify families about upcoming events in a timely fashion. Room parents typically organize classroom celebrations, recruit volunteers for class events, and collect donations for supplies and teacher gifts. They also coordinate with the class's Yearbook Volunteer to make sure photos are being submitted on a regular basis.

Classroom Librarian

Each class needs the help of a parent volunteer for library days. One volunteer will be needed for less than an hour on your scheduled day. Tasks may include:

- Reading to students
- Checking books in and out
- Organizing the book cart
- Shelving books in the library
- Straightening shelves
- Assisting with library displays
- Other duties as determined by your teacher or our Librarian Chair

Explore the Arts and Express Yourself

National PTA's Reflections program provides opportunities for recognition and access to the arts which boost student confidence and success in the arts and in life.

Each year, over 300,000 students in Pre-K through Grade 12 create original works of art in response to a student-selected theme. This 50+ year-old program helps them explore their own thoughts, feelings, and ideas, develop artistic literacy, increase confidence, and find a love for learning that will help them become more successful in school and in life.

The 2022-2023 Reflections theme is "Show Your Voice!"

Students submit their completed works of art in one or all of the available arts categories: Dance Choreography, Film Production, Literature, Music Composition, Photography, Visual Arts.

Students participate in the appropriate division for their grade: Primary (Pre-K - Grade 2), Intermediate (Grades 3-5), Middle School (Grades 6-8), High School (Grades 9-12), Special Artist (All grades welcome). Students who identify as having a disability and may receive services under IDEA or ADA: Section 504 may enter in the Special Artist Division or grade division most closely aligned to their functional abilities.

All entries will be due October 14, 2022.

DROP OFF / PICK UP LINE PROCEDURES STOP

Every weekday morning, approximately 650 children are dropped off at Walteria between 8:35 and 9:00 AM. This creates a surge of traffic, and many people are exhibiting very unsafe behavior as they approach this crowded area.

In order to protect our kids and keep everyone safe during drop off and pick up, here are a few helpful reminders about the official process.

Traffic moves CONTINUOUSLY in the drop off/pick up line.

Do NOT park your car anywhere within the drop off zone during drop off/pick up times. LOADING ZONE: NO PARKING signs are clearly posted along the street. Drivers should NOT exit their vehicles during drop off or pick up.

If your child needs assistance getting in or out of the vehicle, park your car on a side street and walk with them.

Do NOT allow children to exit the vehicle into the street. They should exit on the curb side ONLY.


Traffic moves only ONE WAY in the drop off/pick up line.

Do NOT back up into the line to parallel park at the curb. Drive forward only, and pull as far forward as you can to make room for others.

DO NOT make a U-Turn across Madison to cut into the line.

If you park facing south on Madison (opposite the school) you MUST walk to one of the crosswalks to cross the street.

Do NOT jaywalk across Madison or send children to do so on their own.




Pedestrian Safety

Our crossing guards are hard at work every day trying to keep everyone safe on their way to and from school. Please follow their cues when crossing the street, and be sure to wait for them to clear the intersection before stepping out into traffic.

Do not park your car too close to the crosswalks. It creates a dangerous lack of visibility for everyone involved – motorists, pedestrians, and the crossing guards.

Jaywalking is not only illegal, it's also extremely dangerous. Only cross the streets at the crosswalks, please!
